Accommodations Due to COVID

2019/2020: The last day of in person instruction was March 13, 2020. Taking care of our students' well-being was our school's number one priority. With that in mind, students were given the following grading options for Quarter 3: Numerical grade or Pass. Grading options for Quarter 4: All students received a Pass or No credit as a grade. Final grades are an average of all numerical quarter grades for the year.

2020/2021: The year began with 100% remote learning. We moved to hybrid learning on October 15 & 16 and remained on a hybrid schedule through the remainder of the school year. The hybrid schedule consisted of 2 in person days, 2 virtual days and 1 asynchronous day. Our teachers provided the same rigor virtually as they would through in person instruction.

Individual education programs are developed for each student and courses are offered at varying levels of rigor in the following academic departments: English, Mathematics, Social Studies, Science and World Language. Levels are designated on the transcript as follows:

AP: Advanced Placement / H: Honors / CP: College Preparatory

Due to the unprecedented nature of the last 2 years, information reported on the School Profile will be reported in 5-year Summaries. Despite the many challenges students faced during the pandemic, SHS students maintained a high level of rigorous academic programming. As a result, students' course selection and grades are a much stronger indicator of success in higher education than outcomes on standardized assessments.

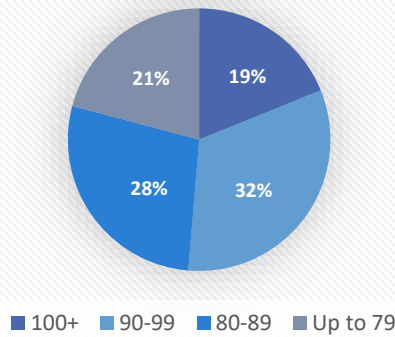

Grading System

GPA is calculated and reported using a $\pm 100\%$ scale. Grades earned in Honors courses receive an additional 1.125 percent weight and Advanced Placement courses receive an additional 1.25 percent weight. In determining class rank, all courses receiving credit are included. Grade Point Average determines the exact rank.
