Accommodations Due to COVID

2021/2022: Springfield High School returned to normal operation to start the 2021/2022 school year. Some small accommodations were made to instructional and assessment frameworks as students continued to rebound from educational losses due to Covid. By mid-year, our academic efforts and expectations for student outcomes had returned to what they were prior to 2020. These efforts are evidenced by our rebound in AP enrollment, attempted tests, and score outcomes, and our SAT and ACT performance levels.

Despite the many challenges students faced during the pandemic, SHS students maintained a high level of rigorous academic programming.
