Purpose

Participation in any extracurricular activity is a privilege, not a right. Student participants in extracurricular activities occupy a high profile both within and beyond the community. As such, they are looked upon as the ambassadors of the Springfield School District ("District"). With this additional celebrity in mind, extracurricular participants are expected to behave at official school functions, at or beyond our community, with the same standards and in accordance with District policies, including the Student Discipline policy, No. 218, and the Drug, Mind-Altering Substance, and Alcohol Abuse policy, No. 227.[1][2]

Guidelines

Students may assume all or part of the costs of travel and attendance at extracurricular events and trips as long as these costs are reviewed through prior notification by the coach or activity leader.

All student participants in extracurricular activities are to be made aware of this policy and its relationship to other policies of the District. To address inappropriate behaviors during extracurricular activities, the District may choose to suspend the student from the extracurricular activity prior to going further into the disciplinary process. Policy No. 218, Student Discipline, may be referred for infractions and discipline procedures. [1][3]
