213. ASSESSMENT OF STUDENT PROGRESS	
<p>1. Purpose Pol. 212</p>	<p>The Board of School Directors (“Board”) of Springfield School District (“District”) recognizes that a system of assessing student achievement can help the student, teachers, and parents to better understand the student’s progress toward personal educational goals.</p>
<p>2. Definition</p>	<p>Assessment shall be that system of measuring and recording student progress and achievement which enables the student, parents, and teachers to learn the student’s strengths and weaknesses and know where remedial work is required.</p>
<p>3. Authority SC 1531, 1532</p>	<p>The Board directs that the instructional program of this District include a system of assessment for all students which is consistent with the educational goals of the District.</p>
<p>4. Delegation of Responsibility</p>	<p>The Superintendent or designee shall develop procedures for assessment which include the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Each student should know what end result and achievements are expected at the outset of any course of study. 2. Each student should be kept informed of his/her personal progress during the course of a unit of study. 3. Methods of assessment shall be appropriate to the course of study and the maturity of students. 4.
