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| <p>1. Purpose</p> | <p style="text-align: center;">249. CLASSES IMPORTED FROM OTHER INSTITUTIONS</p> <p>The Board of School Directors (“Board”) supports and encourages all of the students of Springfield School District (“District”) to participate in academic opportunities made available to them by postsecondary institutions such as colleges, universities, and technical schools. Concurrent enrollment options afford high school students the opportunity to earn both secondary and postsecondary credit either by enrolling in postsecondary endorsed classes taught at the District’s schools or by taking those classes on postsecondary institution campuses or through an online provider.</p> <p>District students taking such classes shall receive equivalent academic credit as though they are enrolled in the postsecondary institution and taking the classes on the postsecondary institution’s campus. This credit shall be identified as accepted by the postsecondary institution towards the completion of a degree or certificate program. The District administration shall negotiate these conditions prior to committing to a postsecondary institution’s program.</p> <p>The Board requests that the District administration ascertains that all postsecondary classes taught in District buildings be certified with the above conditions.</p> <p>If the District administration cannot ascertain whether a particular class meets the above conditions, the class shall be clearly advertised to the District’s students as such prior to their participating in the educational opportunity.</p> <p><u>DISCLAIMERS:</u></p> <p><i>This policy is superseded by all current federal and state laws and mandates.</i></p> <p><i>This online posting is an electronic copy from Springfield School District’s manual of currently adopted policies.
