SPRINGFIELD SCHOOL DISTRICT AGE REQUIREMENTS & MEDICAL VERIFICATION

Age Requirements

The age requirement for Kindergarten admittance is five (5) years, zero (0) months on or before (8/31) August 31st of the year of enrollment. The age requirement for first grade admittance is six (6) years, zero (0) months on or before (8/31) August 31st of the year of enrollment (Board approved: December 10, 1987). A student who has attended kindergarten or first grade in another public school district and is transferring to the Springfield School District will be accepted even if he/she does not meet Springfield's age requirement. The student must have completed the first marking period or a minimum of forty-five (45) days in the previous public school district. Springfield's age requirement applies for students who attended a private or parochial Kindergarten program and want to attend first grade at Springfield.

Physical and Dental Exams

Pennsylvania Health State Law requires a physical examination, given within one (1) year of enrollment, upon entrance to school in kindergarten or grade one (1) and again in grades six (6) and eleven (11). Dental examinations, given within one (1) year of enrollment, are required in kindergarten or grade one (1) and in grades three (3) and seven (7). If your child is new to Pennsylvania schools, current physical and dental examinations are required.

Immunization Records (fact sheet on reverse)

The following inoculations are required according to Pennsylvania State law for all students:

- Four (4) doses of tetanus, diphtheria, and acellular pertussis* (1 dose on or after the 4th birthday)
- Four (4) doses of polio (4th dose on or after 4th birthday and at least 6 months after previous dose given)**
- Two (2) doses of measles, mumps, rubella***
- Three (3) doses of hepatitis B
- Two (2) doses of varicella (chickenpox) or evidence of immunity
 - *Usually given as DTP or DTap or if medically advisable, DT or Td
 - **A fourth dose is not necessary if the third dose was administered at age 4 years or older and at least 6 months after the previous dose
 - ***Usually given as MMR

Children in 7th grade will also need the following inoculations:

- One (1) dose of tetanus, diphtheria, acellular pertussis (Tdap) on the first day of 7th grade
- One (1) dose of meningococcal conjugate vaccine (MCV) on the first day of 7th grade

Children in 12th grade will also need the following inoculations:

• One (1) dose of MCV on the first day of 12th grade. If one dose was given at 16 years of age or older, that shall count as the 12th grade dose.


Immunization Exemption

If you have chosen to withhold or delay immunizations for your school age child(ren), you must submit a letter stating the reason for the exemption. These requirements allow for the following exemptions: medical reason, religious beliefs, or philosophical/strong moral or ethical conviction. Even if your child is exempt from immunizations, he or she may be excluded from school during an outbreak of vaccine preventable disease.

SCHOOL VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS FOR ATTENDANCE IN PENNSYLVANIA SCHOOLS

FOR ATTENDANCE IN ALL GRADES CHILDREN NEED THE FOLLOWING:





- 4 doses of tetanus, diphtheria, and acellular pertussis*
 (1 dose on or after the 4th birthday)
- 4 doses of polio (4th dose on or after 4th birthday and at least 6 months after previous dose given)**
- 2 doses of measles, mumps, rubella***
- 3 doses of hepatitis B
- 2 doses of varicella (chickenpox) or evidence of immunity
 - *Usually given as DTP or DTaP or if medically advisable, DT or Td
- ** A fourth dose is not necessary if the third dose was administered at age 4 years or older and at least 6 months after the previous dose
- ***Usually given as MMR

ON THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL, unless the child has a medical or religious/philosophical exemption, a child must have had at least one dose of the above vaccinations or risk exclusion.

- If a child does not have all the doses listed above, needs additional doses, and the next dose is medically appropriate, the child must receive that dose within the first five days of school or risk exclusion. If the next dose is not the final dose of the series, the child must also provide a medical plan (red and white card) within the first five days of school for obtaining the required immunizations or risk exclusion.
- If a child does not have all the doses listed above, needs additional doses, and the next dose is not medically appropriate, the child must provide a medical plan (red and white card) within the first five days of school for obtaining the required immunizations or risk exclusion.
- The medical plan must be followed or risk exclusion.

FOR ATTENDANCE IN 7TH GRADE:

- 1 dose of tetanus, diphtheria, acellular pertussis (Tdap) on the first day of 7th grade.
- 1 dose of meningococcal conjugate vaccine (MCV) on the first day of 7th grade.

ON THE FIRST DAY OF 7TH GRADE, unless the child has a medical or religious/philosophical exemption, a child must have had the above vaccines or risk exclusion.

FOR ATTENDANCE IN 12TH GRADE:

• 1 dose of MCV on the first day of 12th grade. If one dose was given at 16 years of age or older, that shall count as the twelfth grade dose.

ON THE FIRST DAY OF 12TH GRADE, unless the child has a medical or religious/philosophical exemption, a child must have had the above vaccines or risk exclusion.

The vaccines required for entrance, 7th grade and 12th grade continue to be required in each succeeding school year.

These requirements allow for the following exemptions: medical reason, religious belief, or philosophical/strong moral or ethical conviction. Even if your child is exempt from immunizations, he or she may be excluded from school during an outbreak of vaccine preventable disease.
