The Academy Model

Springfield students must earn 24 credits to graduate. Three of these credits are required to be earned in a designated Academy. During their sophomore year, students must select between 1 of 5 Career Academies: Humanities, Business, STEM, Arts, and Liberal Arts. The purpose of Springfield's Career Academy model is to encourage thoughtful and purposeful decisions around course selection, create small learning communities, and to promote hands on learning experiences through partnerships with local businesses.

Academic Information

Individual education programs are developed for each student, and courses are offered at varying levels of difficulty in the following academic departments: English, Mathematics, Social Studies, Science and Spanish. Levels are designated on the transcript as follows:

AP: Advanced Placement / H: Honors / CP: College Preparatory

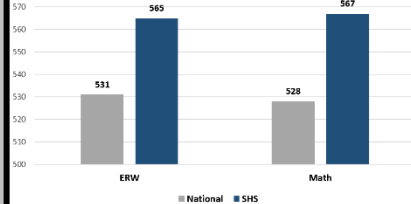

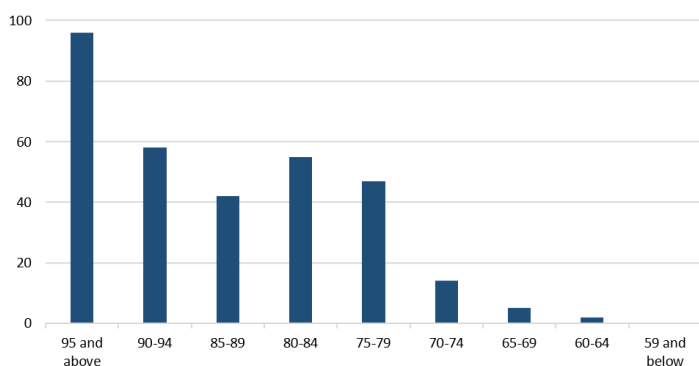
Grading System

GPA is calculated and reported using a \pm 100% scale. Grades earned in Honors courses receive an additional 1.125 percent weight and Advanced Placement courses receive an additional 1.25 percent weight. In determining class rank, all courses receiving credit are included. Grade Point Average determines the exact rank.

Recognitions

- US News & World Report "Best High Schools" - 88th percentile / Niche "Best Public High School in Pennsylvania" - 93rd percentile
- Springfield Athletic Teams: Combined have earned 39 Central League Titles, 17 District Titles, 4 State Titles and 1 National Title since 2000. In the past 5 years, 31 students have gone on to play DI athletics and 23 have gone on to play DII athletics.
- The Spri-Hian (school newspaper): 1st place in the American Scholastic Press Association's annual contest two years in a row (2018 and 2019)
- Future Business Leaders of America: 3 students placed nationally in 2018 and 25 state qualifiers in 2019.
- PA Junior Academy of Science: 3 students earned perfect scores, 16 students placed 1st and 7 students placed second.
- Honors Medical Technology: 16 students were selected through a highly rigorous application process for this advanced medical science program.

- Mini-Thon: Springfield High School boasts the nation's largest school-based Pediatric Cancer fundraiser which has donated over 2 million dollars in the past decade alone.
